

# Over \$20M in grants awarded to companies and partners since 2006



## Over **565** companies supported through grants and programs



- Over 4,320 Jobs Created
- Over \$580M Raised in Funding
- 83 Companies Raised Over \$1M
- 30 Companies Raised Over \$5M
- 29 Companies Acquired
- 70% Still in Business
- 57% Under-Served



Funding in the amount of \$10,000 to help entrepreneurs who are testing a big, new business idea.



#### Over \$1.6M awarded to 162 companies

- Over 578 Jobs Created
- Over \$63M Raised in Funding
- 55% Female-Founded
- 49% Minority-Founded



Funding in the amount of \$50,000 to advance startups by helping them gain customers and/or attract future investment.



#### Over \$9M awarded to 200 companies

- Over 2,745 Jobs Created
- Over \$484M Raised in Funding
- 22 Companies Acquired
- 70% Still in Business

Bringing the power of entrepreneurial thinking to the masses through deployment of the Ice House Entrepreneurship Program.



#### 10 facilitator trainings held

- Over 5,000 mindsets reached
- Bold ambition to educate 100,000 people in North Carolina



Funding to help entrepreneurship advocates offer programs, pilot new initiatives, and organize virtual and in-person events that bring people together to support entrepreneurial activity.



#### Over \$1.6M awarded in 325 grants

- First grant awarded in 2017
- Emphasis on DEI



Strengthening the infrastructure for North Carolina's entrepreneurs through regional ecosystem summits and grant funding to statewide partners executing creative programs.



#### Over \$7M awarded in 92 grants

- 60% Partners from Outside Research Triangle
- Over 2,885 companies supported
- Over 23,400 event attendees via partners



Leads NC IDEA in its programmatic and grant making ambitions to address the challenges of Black entrepreneurship in North Carolina.



Over \$2M awarded in grants to Blackfounded companies and partners elevating Black entrepreneurship

- NC BEC formed in July 2020
- 14 grants to partners
- 7 grants to Black-founded startups
- 5 grants to NC accredited HBCUs

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





 MWUYF partners with local restaurants to provide local, seasonal, fresh food for their menus.

#### Direct Sales:


- MWUYF provides weekly prescription food boxes filled with fresh produce accompanied by grocery bags filled with various shelf- staple food items Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) Program- MWUYF distributes 10-12 pound bags of fresh produce bags weekly, free of charge, to senior centers,
- daycare centers, low-income household
