### PLANS FOR SUSTAINABILITY



The steering committee is grateful to OSOW and considers one of our biggest opportunities for continued growth is the mini-grant funding as we hope the results will connect us with the small percentage (4.2%) of Opportunity Youth in Orange County.

Greatest strength to sustain SCA: We believe our ability to have SCA repeated in other counties statewide with a "plug and play" program will give students statewide this fantastic pre-apprenticeship opportunity.
